

PeDRA (the Pediatric Dermatology Research Alliance) was formed in 2012 as an international organization of physicians and other researchers dedicated to optimizing skin health and curing skin diseases in children.

<u>Mission</u>: The mission of PeDRA is to promote and facilitate high quality collaborative clinical, translational, educational, and basic science research in pediatric dermatology.

<u>Vision</u>: The vision of PeDRA is to create sustainable collaborative research networks to better understand, prevent, treat and cure dermatologic diseases in children.

The Alliance – made up of clinicians and researchers committed to advancing pediatric dermatology research – will create a platform for high quality and collaborative pediatric clinical, translational and bench research.

There has been significant progress in just 6 months:

- The Society for Pediatric Dermatology (SPD) provided funds to cover administrative and planning needs;
- An executive committee and sub-committees have formed. Committees have been organized to tackle organizational planning & goal setting, grants and fundraising, as well as communications & outreach:
- Initial foci of research for PeDRA include: Vascular anomalies (Hemangioma of infancy); Inflammatory skin disease (atopic dermatitis, psoriasis, acne); and Genetic disorders (epidermolysis bullosa (EB) and ichthyosis). These foci will be refined over time;
- We have established an annual PeDRA meeting to discuss pediatric dermatology research priorities and set a research roadmap. The inaugural meeting is Oct. 18-20, 2013, at the Westin O'Hare Hotel in Rosemont, IL (R13 submitted for NIH funding);
- A PeDRA meeting open to all to be held just prior to the annual SPD meeting, in Milwaukee on Wed., July 10, 2013. This is a great opportunity to learn more about PeDRA and to get involved in the early work of the organization;
- PeDRA will have a breakout session at the upcoming July SPD called: So you want to do Clinical Research? - Sat., July 13, 2013, This is a practical "how to" session covering the IRB approval process, regulatory issues, multi-site trials, and working with industry;

- PeDRA played an important role in organizing a tri-continental Pediatric Dermatology pre-meeting symposium at the International Investigative Dermatology meetings in Edinburgh (Weds., May 8th, 9 am - 12 pm).
